1. REGISTRATION

Registration will commence at 4.00 pm on Thursday, 31st July, where you will be provided with details of your room allocation and conference schedule. Those participating in the workshops and seminars will receive their conference pack, including the t-shirt. Those who are not participating in the workshops will not be provided with a conference pack.

The evening meal will be served at 6.30 pm in the dining room. If you are unable to arrive before 6.30 pm, please let us know as soon as possible.

Conference opening night praise and worship will commence at 7.45 pm (Doors open at 7.30 pm) in the John Kirkham Hall. Registration will therefore close until after the service.

All food and refreshments will be provided by the centre throughout the conference period. There are tea-making facilities available in bedrooms and in the kitchenette area of the bedrooms. Refreshments are available in the reception area throughout the day.

All beddings, including duvet, pillows and sheets for single beds are provided, but feel free to bring your own if you wish. Towels are also provided, but you will need to take your toiletries and make your bed each morning.

All rooms have twin single beds for 2 participants only. Can you let us know the name of the person you have agreed to share a room with? If no arrangements have been made, we are happy to assist in identifying a roommate. There is a limited number of single rooms available with a supplement fee. 2. DRESS ATTIRE

During workshop sessions, please wear loose-fitting clothes such as non-revealing long shirts and tracksuit bottoms. Revealing leggings, leotards, tights, tank tops, halters, or hip-hugging shorts are not appropriate forms of dress during this conference. Please wear appropriate footwear for comfort and flexibility, according to your daily schedule. Outdoor footwear will be required for ministering on Saturday, weather permitting.

Jewellery should also be kept to a bare minimum: wedding/engagement rings, studs, and watches. Please remove all necklaces, bracelets, and large earrings. These can become

tangled up within an arm of a fellow delegate, specifically in a movement class and cause injury.

If you have worship garments, feel free to wear them during evening services on Thursday, Friday, and Sunday Morning. The colour codes for garments are as follows.

Thursday Evening – Blue or personal choice of bold colours with blue included. Blue represents the Holy Spirit and anointing, heaven, healing and hope.

Friday Daytime – Please wear a previous conference t-shirt with suitable bottoms.

Friday International Evening – Colours to reflect the country of birth, or where you currently live or have adopted as the nation/nations you are currently praying over.

Saturday Daytime – Conference T-shirt provided and black tracksuit/jogging bottoms or loose leggings. Outdoor footwear.

Sunday Morning Service – White and/or gold.

Sunday PUSH Graduation programme – Previous graduates of PUSH programmes. Please wear graduation garments with white undergarments if possible.

3. MARKETPLACE

We will have vendors in the reception area of the conference centre displaying several items which include worship garments, books, pampering products, flags, bags, other worship tools, paintings, and cards. To avoid disappointment, ensure you have extra funds to purchase items.

All participants aged 17 and younger must have written parental consent to participate in this conference.

9. WORKSHOP GROUPS

Joshua Generation - Children/Teenagers

This group will have a wide range of abilities. Most would have experienced being part of a dance ministry, whilst for others this would be a new experience for them. Where necessary, leaders may have to split the group according to abilities.



Genesis - Women Adults

This group is largely for women who have some dance experience, possibly as part of a ministry group or in personal worship. Dance leaders in particular would benefit from learning new choreography which can be taught to the group they manage. All would benefit from learning different styles of dance which can also be used in public worship. Participants need to be of a good level of fitness.



Miriam Worship Dancers

For women of all ages, who prefer movement/dance at a slower pace. Some may have very limited experience in dance or just starting to dance in public. The workshops will encourage participants to identify their own limitations in movement and utilise their abilities to worship in dance.



Warriors for Christ and Young Warriors - Boys to Men

This group is for boys and men of all ages, fitness and abilities. You will have an opportunity to get together to discuss and explore their role within the ministry in dance. They will have opportunity to challenge myths around boys/men and dance, identify their own skills and be taught choreography which can be used for either personal or public worship.
